As we move into the next century of ministry, we are called to expand our capacity to do all these things. God invites us to prepare our space to welcome all of God's people year-round. The challenges facing our city, our church, and our world are many and complex. But as Bishop Barbara Harris liked to say, "The power behind us is greater than the challenges ahead of us."

OUR PLAN

Our diocesan *Together Now* 2016 campaign afforded a visionary renovation of our Cathedral. The flexible, revitalized space in the Sanctuary and Sproat Hall expanded our outreach and ministry, but there is one final step: to complete the work that was begun in 2016, by installing air-conditioning in the Sanctuary and Sproat Hall, replacing the failing air-conditioning in the Clark and Sears buildings, and making the office buildings fully accessible to those with mobility limitations.

Not only will this work make the space more useful for worship, performances, and special events year-round, it will allow us to serve the city missionally as a gathering place for those speaking out for social justice, a place of theological formation, and a center of hospitality for the visual and performing arts. The accessibility work in our office buildings will make the whole 138 campus welcoming to all, opening up new possibilities for collaboration and rentals.

THE DETAILS

The project is estimated to cost \$4.8 million. The Diocese is expected to be a major partner in meeting this cost. The Cathedral is responsible for at least half of the project expense and expects that \$1.2 million will be raised through our Capital Campaign and the remainder will come from the Cathedral's endowment.

The Cathedral's commitment to be good stewards of the environment has not waivered. And although the project will bring air conditioning to the Sanctuary and Sproat Hall for the first time, the environmental impact of this project will be mitigated by replacing the end-of-life systems in our office building with systems developed to maximize energy efficiency at today's standards. In addition, we are committing to increase our utilization of renewable energy sources. Currently, we purchase our energy through a local cooperative buying group which sources approximately 30% of energy from sustainable energy sources e.g., solar and wind which will continue to demonstrate our desire to decrease our environmental impact.

OUR MISSION AND MINISTRIES

The Cathedral Church of St. Paul is a *House of Prayer for All People*, amplifying the mission of the Diocese of Massachusetts. All that we do is grounded in this mission and participates in our strategic plan, which you can find on our website.

- We serve a wide range of worshipping communities including our Sunday Congregation, The Crossing, MANNA, La Misa (Spanish Mass), a vibrant Muslim community, and a diocesan Chinese Congregation.
- We also offer daily Morning Prayer, and weekly Spiritual Rehydration and Sung Compline.
- We host the people of the diocese for prayer, training, and for justice-making action.
- Our Ministry of the Steps creatively brings the values and radical welcome of the cathedral out the front doors and onto the front plaza throughout the summer.

- We host episcopal liturgies like ordinations and confirmations, and partner with the diocese to host all manner of meetings and special events throughout the year.
- We rent office space to several non-profits doing life-giving work in the community.
- The cathedral's space is used by several arts groups on a regular basis and other non-profits for special meetings and celebrations.

WHAT YOU ARE BEING ASKED TO DO

 Read over the information contained in this brochure and prayerfully consider a sacrificial gift to the best of your ability.

We are asking you to consider a leadership pledge to our campaign. This pledge could be paid with a 10% down payment and monthly installments over a three or four-year period. If your situation permits a more substantial pledge, your extra generosity will be most appreciated. If your situation warrants a lesser amount, we ask that you respond as generously as possible.

Remember, not everyone can give at the same level. However, everyone can make the same sacrifice.

Complete the enclosed pledge form. State
the total amount of your pledge, enclose
your down-payment check, and select the
payment plan you prefer for the remainder
of your pledge.

Payment reminders will be mailed to you based on the schedule you select on your pledge form: monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, annually or however you stipulate.

3. Please mail or bring the pledge card to the cathedral. We are asking you to make your pledge within two weeks. This will give our campaign the needed momentum for success.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND

No one can tell you how much you should give. You are the only one who decides what to contribute, since everyone's financial obligations are different. What you give will be held in the strictest confidence.

All contributions, from the smallest to the largest, will be gratefully appreciated. Your decision is a personal one. It should be made in a spirit of committed Christian stewardship.

AS YOU MAKE YOUR PLEDGE, REMEMBER...

- Payments would best be made over a period of 36 months (3 years) or less.
- Pledge payments are in addition to your other support for the Cathedral.
- Payment reminders and a special payment envelope will be mailed to you in accordance with your payment plan.
- All payments toward your pledge are deductible for tax purposes.
- Please make checks payable to: *Cathedral Church of St. Paul.* Please note in the memo section "Capital Campaign." If the check is coming from a third party (Fidelity, Vanguard, etc.) please have them include your name in the memo section.

AN APPEAL FOR SPECIAL GENEROSITY

If you are financially able to pledge as much as \$10,000, \$25,000, \$50,000 or more, we ask you to consider being a leader in our campaign.

TAX ADVANTAGES OF THOUGHTFUL GIVING

Federal and state laws on income and inheritance taxes encourage charitable giving. All annual contributions to our campaign are tax deductible for those who itemize their deductions.

For some, a gift from a mandatory IRA distribution can be beneficial to both the Cathedral and the donor. Check with your financial planner.

It is particularly advantageous for some people to contribute appreciated securities (stock), real property, or other valuables. The current fair market value of securities or property is deductible, and by transferring these assets to the church the donor pays no capital gains tax.
